AJ 120 C	This course offers an analysis of the doctrines of criminal liability in the United States and the classification of crimes against persons, property, morals, and public welfare. Special emphasis is placed on the classification of crime, the general elements	3
Cultural Anthropology		
ANTH 102 C	This course explores how anthropologists study and compare human culture. Cultural anthropologists seek to understand the diversity of human experience focusing on a set of central issues: how people around the world make their living (subsistence pattern)	3
Computer Information Systems		
CIS 111 C	This course is an introduction to computer concepts, computer organization, operation, hardware, systems and application software; business-problem solving; and applications to business. (UC/CSU, AA GE, CSU GE)	3
Cybersecurity Competition Fundamentals		
CIS 190 C	This course provides students with the fundamental knowledge to participate in various cybersecurity competitions. Topics will include Cybersecurity essentials, OS installation and hardening, Windows and Linux administration and networking fundamentals. A	3
